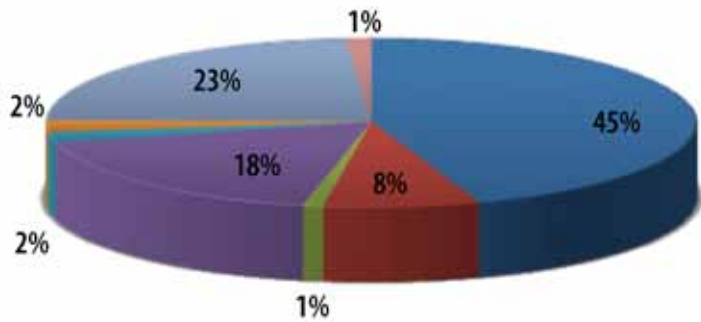

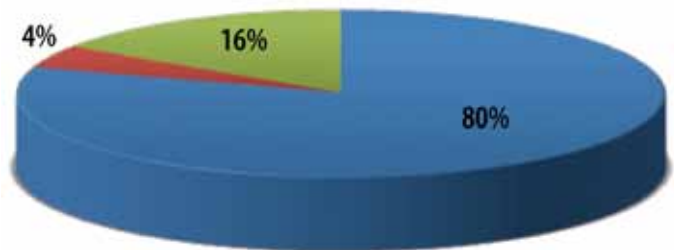

# Frequently Asked Questions

## Q What is the Kansas City Rescue Mission (KCRM)?

**A** The Mission is a compassionate outreach to poor and homeless people. Every day of the year, we provide the poorest in our community with nutritious meals, safe, secure shelter and other crucial relief services. For men who wish to break free from the cycles of poverty and addiction, we offer our Christian Community of Recovery. KCRM is a training center where men can meet the future with hope and confidence as they become grounded in a relationship with Jesus Christ and equipped with practical skills for life.

## Q When was KCRM founded and by whom?

**A** Dr. Jarrette Aycock founded the Mission in 1950. As a young man, Aycock was an alcoholic who wandered the country drinking and gambling until the night he attended a rescue mission chapel service. That night, he turned his life and will over to God and began a new life. Thirty-two years

later, he founded the Kansas City Rescue Mission. In 1985, Rev. Joe Colaizzi became the Mission's executive director and continues to serve today. KCRM moved to its present location at 1520 Cherry Street in 1991.

## Q Is my donation tax-deductible?
